



C-SPAN's "Supreme Court Week" Debuts October 4, 2009

--Original 90-minute Feature on Supreme Court--

--Exclusive interviews with Every Current and Retired Justice—

--TV production and video-rich Website--

Washington, DC (September 3, 2009) – On October 4th, just as the U.S. Supreme Court opens its new term and welcomes new Justice Sotomayor, C-SPAN invites Americans to tour the Supreme Court building and hear directly from the Justices during the network's newest special feature series, "Supreme Court Week."

C-SPAN's "Supreme Court Week" debuts on October 4 at 9 PM (ET) with a 90-minute original feature documentary on the Supreme Court, described mostly through the commentary of the Justices who serve there. Over the following week, C-SPAN will air its exclusive one-on-one interviews with all current and retired Justices in their entirety-- the first time so many Justices have granted interviews for a television production.

The documentary, produced by C-SPAN's Mark Farkas, focuses on the Court's iconic home, built in 1935 with the urging of William Howard Taft -- the only U.S. President to later serve as Chief Justice. The production offers rarely-seen video of areas accessible only to the Justices and their staffs, including the Justices' "Robing Room" and Private Dining Room. Viewers will have extensive views of the Courtroom and visit some of the Justices' offices, known as "chambers." Chief Justice Roberts describes the Court as "the prettiest building in Washington."

C-SPAN president Susan Swain explains, "The Court, and the Chief Justice, granted C-SPAN extensive access to their iconic building and to themselves. Viewers will have a rare opportunity to hear the Justices talking about the role of the Court, its traditions, and its history."

"The Supreme Court: Home to America's Highest Court" completes C-SPAN's original feature documentaries on the symbolic homes of the three branches of American government: "The White House: Inside America's Most Famous Home" debuted in December 2008; "The Capitol" premiered on C-SPAN in July 2006.
